Day Conference Organisers' Report 2017-18

1. Spring conference University of Nottingham

The Spring 2018 conference in Nottingham went ahead against the odds and the "Beast from the East". It was clear that in the last few days before the conference that snow and freezing temperatures might cause travel problems but as always in such circumstances it was difficult to predict what would happen on the day. As it turned out the conditions in Nottingham were fine for travel but unfortunately many delegates had problems closer to home so numbers attending on the day were rather lower than anticipated (based on those who had paid for the conference in advance). This caused some last minute changes to the programme as those who had wished to present were not always able to make it. The numbers in brackets above indicate numbers of participants registered and session proposals accepted.

2. BCME Conference University of Warwick (report contributed by Natthapoj Vincent Trakulphadetkrai)

BCME9 was the most successful BCME conference in terms of: 1) the number of sessions (357); 2) the number of delegates (600); and 3) the 'financial surplus' made (to be split between the JMC, the ATM and the MA).

The BCME's Informal Proceedings was led by Sue Pope, and are now online at https://www.bcme.org.uk/Informal-Proceedings.

The BCME's BSRLM Research Proceedings is being led by Jennie Golding, and should be available in Autumn this year.

BCME9's mop-up meeting took place on Monday 14th May 2018. The focus was on lessons learned from BCME9 that can help to improve BCME10. Other discussions include potential alternative BCME conference formats (e.g. one-day conference instead to make it less costly for JMC to organise and for delegates to attend, as well as to try to avoid the "too big / too overwhelming" feeling, etc.)

The BCME10 Committee will be formed once the next Chair of the BCME Committee has been appointed.

Once the BCME10 Committee has been appointed, BSRLM will then need to nominate a BSRLM Representative to attend BCME Committee meetings, along with the ATM and The MA Representatives. (For BCME9, the BSRLM Representative was Vince)

3. Summer Conference University of Wales Trinity St David, Swansea

The summer 2018 conference took place in Swansea, with the new researchers' day on 8th June and the main conference on 9th June. Both conferences were well attended and include a range of interesting presentations and work groups.

We are grateful to the local hosts, Rachel Wallis, Helen Denny and Jane Waters and their support team for their help in organising the conference.

At the New Researchers' Day there were two keynote presentations: one (morning) by Sofya Lyakhova from Swansea University entitled: "What does mathematics as a discipline tell us about how to teach it, how to research it and how to do research in mathematics education?" and one (afternoon) by Jane Waters (University of Wales Trinity St David's) entitled: "Research writing or 'dissemination': Know your purpose, know your audience and know your message!" Both were well received. Eight practising teachers of mathematics in Wales attended the conference, sponsored by the National Network for Excellence in Mathematics in Wales, and five of these had reports on their research published in the Informal Proceedings.

The morning of the main conference began with a well received plenary talk by Jeremy Hodgen.
