The BSRLM Summer day conference and New Researchers' Day

The conference was held at the University of Birmingham.

Presentations at the New Researchers' Day included:

6 research workshops (5 x 30, 1 x 60)

New Researchers' Day

In all there were 25 attendees, 3 of which were members of the exec, one was an outside speaker and one was the local organiser.

The programme began with a plenary lecture entitled *Writing for peer-reviewed publication* (by Jennie Golding). The afternoon session began with a plenary interactive session entitled *What do you need to know to critique or employ statistical analysis in research?*, presented by Ian Davison (University of Birmingham).

The presentations by new researchers followed the plenaries: there were seven half hour presentations and one hour-long presentation.

Feedback from the attendees suggests that the day went well and was valued by the participants.

Table 2, below, provides a table of data relating to previous new researchers' days, for comparison. The Birmingham day attracted fewer new researchers than in recent years but enough to make a good group. The number of proposals submitted was perhaps disappointing.
